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New eFile and Pay System for Reemployment Tax: What Florida Needs To Know

On August 24, 2026, the Florida Department of Revenue (Department) transitioned reemployment tax filing and payment services to a new eFile and Pay system.

Taxpayers filing late or amended returns are now using the new system. Most employers will first use the new system to file their electronic *Employer's Quarterly Report* (RT-6) for the third quarter of 2026, which is due October 31, 2026.

What to Expect in October 2026

- **Employers will access the new system at floridarevenue.com/taxes/filepay and select **Reemployment Tax – Employers, Agents, and Employee Leasing** under the **eFile and Pay Taxes and Fees** section.**
- **Bookmarks for the old site cannot be used to file or pay.** The buttons to file and pay on the old site are inactive. The old site will remain available through **September 30, 2026**, only for retrieving historical information. If you want to retain copies of historical records, you must retrieve them before September 30, 2026.
- **Employers will use their current login credentials to access the new system.**
Depending on how you access the system, you can log in using your:
 - User ID and password or
 - Reemployment tax (RT) number and federal employer identification number (FEIN) or individual taxpayer identification number (ITIN)

Start a New Return

Saved Credentials and Password Retrieval

- **Login credentials saved in the old system will not transfer to the new system.** You must manually enter your credentials when accessing the new system.
- **If you saved your login information in a browser**, obtain and store it in a secure location so it is available when you file your electronic return.
- **Employers enrolled in eServices can retrieve their User ID and Password** through the Department's self-service **Password Retrieval Portal** at taxapps.floridarevenue.com/PortalPasswordRetrieval.

When reviewing the training materials, be sure to review the calculation field and required check boxes pertaining to out-of-state wages and installment plans.

Import Functionality

The file structure used to submit returns will not change when you move from the old system to the new system.

File and Pay Early

The Department strongly encourages employers to file and pay as early as possible in October. Filing and paying early allows you time to become familiar with the new system and may help you avoid longer wait times for assistance, particularly during the peak periods of October 15-20 and October 26-31.
