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**FLORIDA CORPORATE INCOME TAX “PIGGYBACKS”
2007 INTERNAL REVENUE CODE**

Every year, the Florida Legislature adopts the current Internal Revenue Code (Title 26, United States Code) so that certain tax definitions and the calculation of adjusted federal income are consistent between the Internal Revenue Code and the Florida Income Tax Code (Chapter 220, Florida Statutes). The Florida corporate income tax “piggybacks” federal income tax determinations, and uses adjusted federal income as the starting point for computing Florida net income.

Chapter 2007-35, Laws of Florida, amends the Florida Income Tax Code to adopt the Internal Revenue Code, retroactive to January 1, 2007. This means that Florida will follow the computation of federal taxable income.
